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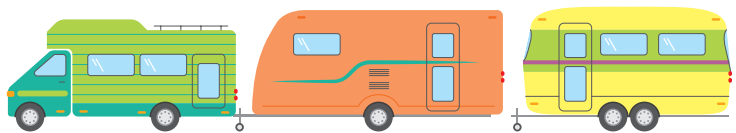

This could be to our benefit, hopefully we will have more information to share soon.

## 22. RALLY ATTENDANCE RULES

22.4 In the case of the January, February and March Rallies, attendance at the Camerons Bight Campground, Sorrento, for these Rallies shall be as though the Member / Partner had attended their own Divisional Rally provided that the Member / Partner signs the Rally Attendance Book as required in each instance.

At the Special General Meeting held on the 12th December 2021 discussion was held regarding the use of the funds obtained from the sale of our land at Learmonth. Three proposals were presented.

There was lots of discussion regarding the options, a vote was held with regard to the direction to follow. Option 3 obtained the majority of votes. Following this a motion was put forward:

**Motion:** The Executive be given approval to look for a suitable property within budget and hold another SGM to seek approval to proceed

**82% of the attendees voted in favour.**

The committee will define some requirements and start the process to find a suitable property. If anyone becomes aware of some real estate that may meet our needs please pass the information on to your Divisional Representative or a member of the Executive Committee.

The grounds also contain an amazing array of exotic plants, garden exhibits, fountains, waterfalls, floral sculptures, walks and scenic vistas. One exhibit contained the Giant Amazon Waterlily named Victoria Cruziana. The plant is native to the subtropical regions of South America and produces very large lily pads that reach 1.5 – 2 metres in diameter. The lily pads are quite fragile and are covered in razor sharp spines underneath. We left the gardens mid afternoon and returned to camp for a relax as the afternoon was quite warm. We met up again for happy hour and enjoyed a drink and chat before retiring for the evening.

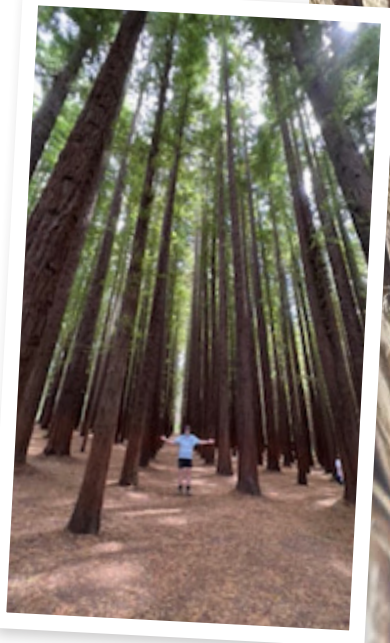

During our time at Warburton, we also visited the Californian Redwood Forest. Covering a small area within the Yarra Ranges National Park, about a 10 minute drive from Warburton. The forest of pines was planted by the Board of Works in about 1930, meaning the trees are nearing a century of growth. The Californian Redwoods, the tallest tree species in the world, have grown to about 50m, though in their native forests in North America with a few more centuries under their belt have reached heights of 115 metres. Access to the forest is easy and has a large carpark at the site, this was an interesting outing and well worth a look.

As the caravan park was quite full, we decided to depart early Sunday morning before rush hour started. The weather was perfect for the weekend, and everyone had a good time.

# DIV 5 RALLY REPORT

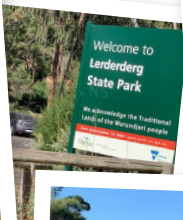
## BACCHUS MARSH

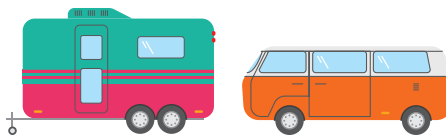
